Appendix A

As the Leq'á:mel Reserves are located within the Fraser Valley Regional District (FVRD); when ever the FVRD declares a Fire Ban has been put into effect, Leq'á:mel shall respect the decision and implement the same Fire Ban on all Leq'á:mel Reserves.

Before deciding to have an "Open-air Burn", you should check the "Venting Index" and only have an "Open-air Burn" on days that are declared "fair" or "good".

1. When Fire Permit is Required:
 - i. *Category 1* – campfires are permitted year round on Leq'á:mel Reserve Lands as long as there is no Fire Ban in place established by the Fraser Valley Regional District.
 - ii. *Category 2* – backyard burns are required to have a Fire Permit from April 1st to October 31st; must check for Fire Bans when permit not required.
 - iii. *Category 3* – all land clearing Fires require a Fire Permit year-round.
2. Open Fire Categories:
 - i. *Category 1* – Campfires (no larger than 18 inches by 18 inches)
 - ii. *Category 2* – Backyard Burns (no large than 3 feet by 3 feet)
 - iii. *Category 3* – Land Clearing Fires (anything larger than 3 feet by 3 feet)
3. Leq'á:mel Lands Office may, by Fire Permit, allow for "Open-Air Burning" of "Burnable Debris", subject to the following:
 - a. All materials to be burnt, must originate from the Property in which the Fire Permit is issued, unless otherwise expressed by the Lands Office.
 - b. Weather conditions immediately prior to and during the burning period to minimize risks of un-controlled fire.
 - c. A competent individual of eighteen (18) years of age, is always on site and provided with adequate means to extinguish the fire.

Fire Pits

- A. A Fire Pit should be constructed with non-combustible material;
 - i. Have maximum diameter of 3 feet;
 - ii. If possible, have a screen or grate to be placed over the fire pit;
- B. Fire Pit shall not be located:
 - i. Closer than nine (9) feet from the property line;
 - ii. Closer than six (6) feet from any combustible material, including but not limited to Buildings, Structures, Fences, Patio Decks and Foliage;

Fine Scale

\$100.00 when served the first Ticket
